# ACROSS THE HALL

Beginning in June the City Council and I began the process of selecting a new City Manager to replace Dale Coulam, who recently retired. Council Member Sharon Gillespie was asked to Chair the Selection Committee and with the help of Char Raine, from our Staff, she developed a comprehensive plan to find the right person to fill that position. Notice was posted on the Utah State and other regional websites advertising the position and inviting interested individuals to apply. Fifty One applications were received from across Utah and surrounding states.

The selection process began with paper screenings of the candidates to dismiss those without the required qualifications or adequate experience. The remaining candidates were interviewed by phone to further reduce the pool of candidates to six finalists who were then interviewed via Zoom by the Selection Committee. Those virtual interviews were recorded for all the Council members to view before the whole City Council gathered and discussed possible finalists. The Selection Committee then settled on three outstanding candidates to recommend to the Council.

Sharon and Char then organized a grueling full day schedule for a recent Thursday Council that began with in depth interviews of all three finalists by pairs of Council Members and me that lasted the morning. After lunch the afternoon was filled with the finalists meeting with Key City Staff and representatives from the Planning Commission and separately with the entire City Council. The Council then began its difficult discussion regarding which of the three they felt should be appointed in the imminent Council Meeting. That discussion touched upon every finalist's qualifications, past experience, management style and ideas for the future and continued until late in the evening. The Council's consensus opinion became an official decision and a formal authorization to extend an offer to a specific candidate at the end of the Council meeting as the clock struck 10:30 pm.

The successful candidate came from a corner of our own City Office Building. Chuck Gillette, who has served Ivins City for over twenty years as our City Engineer and Public Works Director was our final choice. Chuck applied for the position and was treated like any other candidate, but putting aside his familiarity he rose to the occasion and presented himself exceptionally well answering question after question thoughtfully and thoroughly. It became apparent given his background and past experience with the City, his understanding of the cultures of both our administration and our community along with his appreciation of the guiding principles of the General Plan as one of its authors that he should move to the office across the hall.

## Congratulations

This isn't the first time we've hired a City Manager from within. Dale Coulam served as our City Attorney for eight years before becoming our City Manager thirteen years ago and that worked out famously. We anticipate that this appointment will as well. Chuck succeeds two remarkable Ivins City Managers that he deeply respects and intends to emulate as those who developed a highly effective City Staff and a remarkable culture of internal collaboration and caring service the residents of our community. Chuck comes into the position with his own fresh ideas as well. During the interviews he presented his first 90 day plan outlining the process he intends to follow to engage our Staff listening to their needs and concerns and establishing the protocols to address them. By the time he met with the Council the final time before his selection he had created a spreadsheet with additional ideas he had to help him serve effectively in that important position.

When we met with the entire Staff on the Monday morning following the Council's decision to appoint him I introduced Chuck as their new City Manager and jokingly told them that we'll never get the Engineer out of Chuck and that we really don't want to, so expect to see spreadsheets and timelines with detailed plans guiding their future efforts from here on. In my view, those will prove to be useful tools to both organize and track the progress of the city in advancing the provisions of our General Plan. Chuck will officially take his seat on the dais as our new City Manager at the beginning of our next City Council Meeting on September 4th.

Out of necessity, he will continue to shoulder many of his former responsibilities until a new Public Works Director can be found while Tom Jorgensen, unofficially at the moment, will take over the role of City Engineer.

As familiar as the City is to Chuck and managing an important division within it also is, his assuming the position of City Manager will present real challenges and require adjustments both in the focus of his thinking and his interactions with the rest of our City Staff. We are confident that he will face those challenges head on and intentionally make the needed adjustments to become an effective City Manager in the tradition of those who have preceded him. To me, perhaps the most heartfelt and impressive points that Chuck expressed during his quest to become City Manager referenced his genuine love for Ivins City, his deep commitment to it and his demonstrable willingness to work tirelessly to serve it.

So as he moves across the hall to the office with "City Manager" written on it he does so with the full confidence of the City Council and me, and we invite everyone on Staff and in the community to extend him that same level of support. Good luck Chuck!

# HEALTHY IVINS

## September is Suicide Prevention Month

If you're wondering how you can support someone who may be struggling with their mental health, consider taking a suicide prevention training. This training can equip you with the tools to recognize warning signs, offer support and potentially save a life. Your awareness and action can make a difference.

QPR stands for Question, Persuade, and Refer - these 3 simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide. Just as people trained in CPR and the Heimlich Maneuver can help save thousands of lives each year, people trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help.

### KEY STATISTICS:

- 1 in 5 Americans live with a Mental Illness
- 75% of all lifetime mental health conditions begin by age 24
- Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for individuals ages 10-34
- Suicide is among the top 8 causes of death for people ages 10-64

### KEY COMPONENTS COVERED IN TRAINING:

- How to Question, Persuade and Refer someone who may be suicidal
- How to identify warning signs
- How to connect someone in crisis to help

All those that complete the training will feel more empowered to reach out to someone they see who is struggling, as well as receive a 3-year QPR GateKeeper Certification.

## Public Works Department

### CONSTRUCTION



**CenturyLink Fiber Upgrade Project:** CenturyLink is upgrading its network in Ivins by installing new fiber-optic lines. Most work will be done by boring (underground drilling) to minimize surface disturbance; hand trenching will be used where ground or utility conditions require it. All work is occurring within recorded Public Utility Easements (PUEs). Go to <https://fugal.com/neighbor/> for a short video explanation and additional FAQ.

#### Who's doing the work

- **Prime contractor:** Fugal Companies
- **Subcontractor performing construction:** Honmex Communications

#### What to expect

- **Yard access (front and/or rear) & restoration:** Crews may be entering the front and/or rear of your yard to access the PUE to install fiber utilities. The utility/contractor is responsible for restoring disturbed areas to the same or better condition (e.g., re-sod/seed, re-set rock, repair sprinklers in the work area).
- **Above-ground pedestals:** The project requires new utility pedestals (small above-ground boxes) on approximately one-quarter (1/4) of properties.
- **Schedule:** Work will be concentrated through late summer and fall 2025.

#### If something doesn't look right

- **Start with Honmex:** For questions or concerns about how your property was restored, contact **Leslie Rodriguez (801-440-8258)**.
- **If issues aren't resolved:** If the company refuses to restore conditions to the same or better than before, contact Ivins City Public Works and ask for Tom Jorgensen. We can send an inspector to review and help coordinate with CenturyLink.

# Why We Sweep the Streets

Street sweeping sometimes feels like a losing battle. It's like trying to keep your house clean when you have a two-year-old and a three-year-old roaming around while you're trying to take care of a newborn (been there). But it's more than just keeping our roads looking nice, it's an important part of protecting our City and the environment.



Every day, leaves, dirt, trash, and other debris accumulate on our streets. When it rains, that material can wash into our storm drains and eventually flow into local waterways that end up in the Santa Clara River. This pollution not only harms the environment but can also increase flooding risks by clogging storm drains. Regular street sweeping helps keep our stormwater system working properly and keeps pollutants out of our washes and streams.

Let's take a minute to consider the reason why we sweep the streets:

- **Cleaner Streets & Neighborhoods** – It removes litter and debris and makes our community more attractive.
- **Improved Safety** – It clears sand, gravel, and other materials reducing hazards for drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians.
- **Stormwater Protection** – It supports Ivins City's Storm Water Management Program by reducing pollutants before they enter the storm drain system.
- **Extended Pavement Life** – By removing abrasive materials it may help protect roadway surfaces and saves money on long-term maintenance.

Ivins City has an aggressive policy on street sweeping as we sweep every street at least once a month and collectors and arterials are often swept more often than that. The only reason we might miss on this measure is when we are experiencing equipment repairs. The street sweeper is a high-maintenance piece of equipment, and there are times when it is not functioning properly.

During monsoon season, after a big storm, the street sweeper can easily be overwhelmed by the amount of cleanup needed. We ask the public to be patient as we prioritize high-volume roads before local streets. After a large storm, it can take weeks to catch up because many roads require multiple passes before they are fully cleared. I would also like to recognize our street sweeper operator, Ian Pescaia. His hard work and attention to detail are the reason Ivins may have the best-swept streets in the state. Please give him a wave when you see the sweeper out in your neighborhood. He takes great pride in keeping our city clean and safe.

Please help us by not blowing leaves and dirt into the street. Instead, place them in your garbage bins. Let us know if an area needs extra attention. Call Public Works at 634-0689 and we will increase sweeping in an area. Together we can keep Ivins clean, safe, and beautiful.

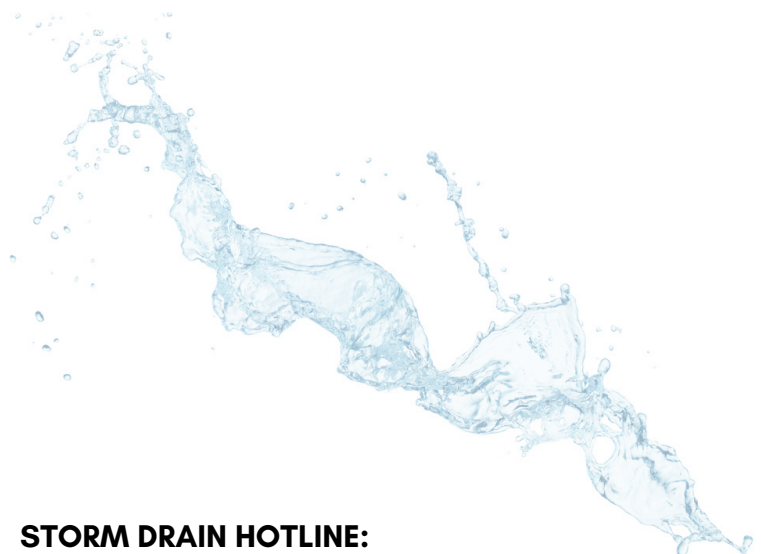
## Water Wisdom

Help the City reach its goal to reduce water use by 10% over the next 10 years.

**Outdoor Tips:** Use a mulching mower that leaves the clippings in the grass; this cools the ground and holds moisture.

**Indoor Tip:** As it cools off in September, reduce watering to twice per week. Skip waterings on rainy days. If you use a professional landscaper, let them know that you don't want to overwater when they set your timers.

## A Community United: Embracing Preparedness with Ivins Inspired

### What does it mean to be “Ivins Inspired”?

It’s more than just a mission statement—it’s the spirit of our community. It’s the connection and respect we share with one another, our local businesses, and our stunning desert environment. And this spirit matters most when we prepare for the unexpected.

Southern Utah is a place of extremes—from flash floods in red canyons to wildfires in the dry heat. While it’s human nature to hope for the best, resilient communities prepare for the worst. A disaster can happen here, and we can’t wait until it does to get ready.

That’s why your involvement is so critical. Utah ranks number one in the nation for volunteerism, and that spirit is one of Ivins’ greatest strengths. Ivins City has a solid Emergency Preparedness Plan, but its true power comes from residents stepping up. With support from Ivins Inspired, the Ivins City Emergency Preparedness Team isn’t just about the city reacting to emergencies—it’s about all of us building resilience together.

### Ways to Get Involved

#### 1. Become a Neighborhood Coordinator – The “Good Neighbor” Initiative

Help 8–10 nearby homes prepare for and respond to disasters by:

- Sharing HUB Box procedures and preparedness tips
- Reporting damage and injuries to the HUB Box
- Assisting neighbors in recovery efforts afterward

#### 2. Join the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

Mayor Chris Hart explains: “CERT is an essential component of our emergency preparedness program. Our CERT team is the second-tier response unit just below our full-time Public Safety Personnel. Their training qualifies them to assist in the stabilization process following a disaster in a truly meaningful way. They are truly a key component in our Disaster Plan.”

To become CERT certified, residents complete a series of classes—typically 2 hours a week for 8 weeks, with Zoom options available.

#### Roles for all strengths and abilities:

- Administrative & communication: record-keeping, radio coordination, leadership roles
- Community outreach: staffing informational booths at local events
- On-the-ground response: search & rescue, first aid, damage assessment, utility shut-off, safety tasks
- Ongoing training to keep skills sharp
