Ivins City Fireworks Restriction

Ivins City is aligning with the statewide restriction on personal fireworks issued by Governor Spencer Cox under Utah's current wildfire emergency declaration. The Governor's Executive Order prohibits the use of personal fireworks during the Independence Day holiday period due to extreme wildfire conditions across the state.

Ivins City will apply the restriction citywide rather than establishing limited local areas for personal fireworks use.

Fire conditions across Utah remain extremely hazardous, and firefighting resources are heavily committed to responding to active wildfires. Local fire personnel are also assisting with statewide wildfire suppression efforts. Reducing preventable fire risk in Ivins helps support these critical emergency operations and preserve response capacity where it is most needed.

Residents are encouraged to enjoy Independence Day celebrations through professionally managed events.

Please note that this restriction does not apply to professionally conducted fireworks displays. Tuacahn Amphitheatre fireworks displays will continue as scheduled. These events are conducted by licensed pyrotechnic professionals operating under approved permits with established fire prevention protocols and on-site suppression resources.

Ivins City appreciates the community's cooperation in supporting statewide wildfire prevention efforts and protecting public safety.



Officially Announced: Ivins Inspired Awarded an AARP Community Challenge Grant

The Ivins Inspired board is so happy to finally share this news with you! Now that AARP has made the announcement public, we can officially tell you that Ivins Inspired has been awarded an AARP Community Challenge Grant for our Safety in Art project. We've been working on this for some time, but AARP asked us to hold the news until they could share it nationally, so thank you for your patience, and now, finally, the full story.

AARP's Community Challenge grants support quick, practical improvements that help residents of all ages live well where they are: safer streets, more accessible public spaces, stronger community connections. We're proud to stand alongside this year's other Utah recipients, all doing meaningful work in their own communities.

This grant helped fund Safety in Art, our pilot asphalt art project at the Red Mountain Boulevard/200 E and Center Street roundabout, designed to creatively calm traffic and improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists of all ages. The artwork was created by Utah Tech University Art Department student Nicki Douberley, and we couldn't be prouder of that collaboration.

An Update on the Project

We also want to keep you in the loop as this work continues. Right now, we're problem-solving a couple of practical issues: the condition of the paint and the best way to clean up tire marks in the roundabout. These things take a little extra thought to get right, and we're grateful for your patience as we work toward a solution that lasts, not just a quick fix.



We also know the color and concept aren't for everyone, and that's okay. We hope residents will give it a chance. Research from Bloomberg Philanthropies has found that city streets with asphalt art become considerably safer for pedestrians once art is incorporated into roadway redesigns. If you'd like to read more about the safety research behind this kind of project, visit asphaltart.bloomberg.org. A follow-up traffic study is planned for this fall, once school is back in session, and we'll have real data to share with you then.



Coming This Fall: A Community Forum on Safety

We're planning a community forum on safety for late summer or early fall, and I hope you'll be part of it. This is your chance to share your thoughts, ask questions, and help shape how this project continues to serve our neighborhood. We don't have a date locked in just yet, but we'll share details on timing and location as soon as they're set. Stay tuned.

A project like this doesn't happen alone. I'm deeply grateful to the organizations who provided letters of support: Southern Utah Veterans Home-Ivins, Vista School, Rocky Vista University - Utah Campus, Santa Clara-Ivins Public Safety, and the Southern Utah Bicycle Alliance. And to Ivins City and the Ivins Arts Commission, thank you for your collaboration and commitment to this project from the very beginning. This is what community looks like.

Fire Safety Starts with Smart Building

Fire safety begins long before a building is occupied, it starts during the design and construction process. Building codes are developed to protect lives and property by reducing fire risks and ensuring occupants have safe ways to exit in an emergency.

Whether you're building a new home, adding an addition, or remodeling an existing structure, it's important to follow approved building plans and obtain the required permits. Fire-resistant construction materials, properly installed smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, safe electrical systems, and adequate emergency exits all play a critical role in protecting your family and your investment.

As we enter the warmer, drier months here in Southern Utah, it's also important to maintain defensible space around your home by clearing dry vegetation and keeping combustible materials away from structures.

The Ivins City Building Department is committed to helping residents build safely and in compliance with current building codes. If you're planning a project, contact the Building Department early in the process. Working together, we can help create safer homes and a safer community for everyone. 2026 Water Quality Update

Our Commitment

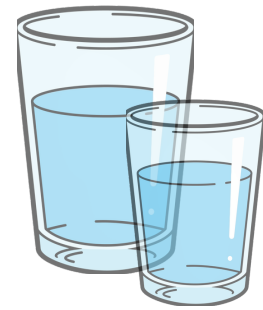
Ivins City Public Works is committed to providing safe, dependable drinking water. The 2026 Consumer Confidence Report confirms that all regulated contaminants measured during 2025 were below state and federal drinking water standards.

Water Quality Highlights

- All tested contaminants were below EPA and Utah Safe Drinking Water Act limits.
- No total coliform bacteria or E. coli were detected in routine samples.
- No lead service lines were identified in the Ivins City distribution system following the 2024 inventory.
- Naturally occurring fluoride is present; Ivins City does not add fluoride.
- No PFAS ('forever chemicals') were detected during EPA UCMR5 monitoring.
- Trace amounts of naturally occurring lithium were detected; no EPA drinking water standard currently exists.
- Water hardness remains relatively high due to groundwater sources; many residents use water softeners.

Where our drinking water comes from

- Gunlock Wells Arsenic Removal Plant (via St. George)
- Quail Creek Water Treatment Plant (regional surface water)
- Sand Hollow Wells (regional groundwater)
- Snow Canyon Wells (jointly owned with St. George and Santa Clara)



Water Conservation Reminder

- Water landscapes every other day when possible.
- Do not irrigate between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- Consider WaterSense irrigation controllers and landscape conversion rebates.
- Help prevent cross-connections by using approved backflow protection.

All residents will receive a mailed copy of the Water Quality Report showing all the results completed on your drinking water here in Ivins City.

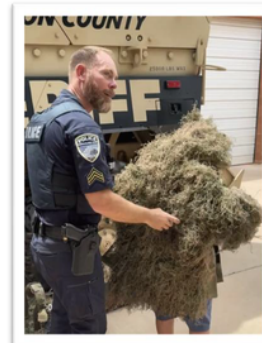

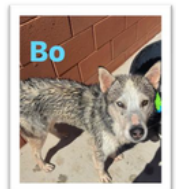
We look forward to building on this success and offering the SCIPD Youth Academy again in the future.

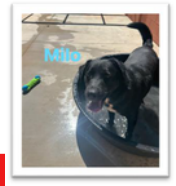
Meet Bo!
