Ivins Fire Station Renovation



As Ivins continues to grow, so does the demand for emergency services. A recent joint Fire/EMS study for Ivins and Santa Clara identified the urgent need to expand and modernize the Ivins Center Street Fire Station to safely serve our community and support the readiness and well-being of our Firefighters and EMS personnel.

What was once considered a long-term project has now become a near-term priority to ensure emergency response keeps pace with the city's rapid growth. This project will ensure that when residents call 911, our firefighters, paramedics, and police officers have the facilities, equipment, and resources necessary to respond quickly and effectively.

A SMART, COST-EFFECTIVE INVESTMENT

Rather than construct an entirely new fire station at an estimated cost of \$10-12 million, the City is pursuing a fiscally responsible remodel and expansion of the existing station for approximately \$5 million.

Thanks to an incredibly generous \$2 million charitable donation from Ivins resident Geoff Schmidt, along with additional private support, impact fees, grants and careful capital planning, the project can move forward. By renovating and expanding the existing station, Ivins can provide long-term safety improvements while avoiding additional taxpayer costs.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

The remodeled station will expand and modernize the facility to meet today's emergency response needs and prepare to serve Ivins for the future.

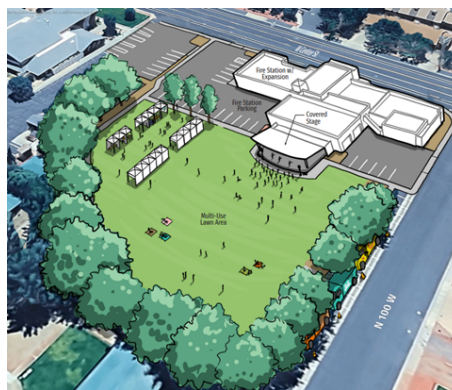
Planned improvements include:

- two longer apparatus bays to accommodate a forthcoming ladder truck,
- expanded and improved living quarters for full-time teams,
- upgraded training space and decontamination capabilities,
- additional office space to accommodate the future growth of the Police Department.

This project focuses on practical improvements that provide the tools, space and infrastructure needed to protect Ivins residents for at least the next 50 years.

WHAT ABOUT THE PARK IMPACTS

You may be aware that there are some impacts to the adjacent Heritage Park. The new plans would encroach approximately forty feet into the existing park. While losing a portion of the park is not ideal, the plan allows the city to meet the needs in the most fiscally responsible manner. As part of the planning process for modifying the park, two primary options have emerged regarding the existing baseball field.



Option 1: Create a Multi-Use Field and Stage



Option 2: Retain a modified baseball field

Option 1: Create a Multi-Use Field and Stage

Under this option, the existing baseball field turns into a large, open multi-use grass field. This approach would create a flexible recreational space capable of supporting a variety of activities, including soccer, flag football, youth sports, community events, water sports, and informal recreation.

An additional benefit of this option is the opportunity to integrate a permanent stage area adjacent to the fire station. This enhancement could transform Heritage Park into an even stronger community gathering place and create an outstanding venue for Heritage Days celebrations, concerts, festivals, and other community events for years to come.

This option would create a more versatile community space. The City could also consider replacing the baseball field as part of a future park development project.

Option 2: Retain a Modified Baseball Field

The second option would preserve the baseball field but reduce its depth from approximately 200 feet to 180 feet.

It is important to note that even at its current size, the field is primarily suitable for Little League play and practice activities. The field is not a regulation baseball diamond, as it does not include features such as a raised pitching mound and is generally used as a practice and recreational field rather than a competitive baseball venue.

Reducing the field to 180 feet would allow the field to remain in place, although its functionality would be further limited.

LOOKING AHEAD

For generations, Ivins residents have benefited from the foresight of community leaders who invested in the infrastructure and public services that make our city exceptional. The Fire Station Renovation Project continues that tradition by preparing our community for the next 50 years of growth while ensuring that residents receive the highest level of public safety service possible.

LET'S TALK ABOUT *Water Conservation*

It's that time of year and the weather is starting to warm up! Did you know that the Washington County Water Conservancy District (WCWCD) offers several incentives for different measures of water conservation?



Receive up to \$2 for each square foot of grass removed and replaced with water-efficient landscaping.



Receive up to \$100 when you purchase an eligible WaterSense smart controller.



Receive up to \$150 when you replace an old toilet with a WaterSense-labeled toilet.

Now is the best time of year to understand how your sprinklers work. Do you know how often they are set to water? Do you forget to adjust when you're out of town or when the weather changes? You're not the only one!



A smart sprinkler timer can help you out with that! The WCWCD even offers a \$100 rebate for one of these timers! Smart irrigation controllers work like a regular sprinkler timer, but they can also be controlled by a user-friendly app on your phone. One of the most important things to check before buying is the number of zones your current sprinkler system has, since each zone controls a separate area of the yard. These controllers are available in different zone counts depending on the model, so residents should choose one that matches their system. Also, consider where the existing timer is located: the Rain Bird ARC8* and Orbit B-hyve* models listed below are indoor/outdoor ready, while the Rachio R3* is an indoor controller and would need a separate outdoor enclosure if installed outside.

Rain Bird ARC8 - 8-Zone for \$109

Orbit B-hyve - 6-Zone for \$118 or 12-Zone for \$138

Rachio R3 - 8-Zone Indoor (can be outdoor with \$40 enclosure) - \$199

*all these models are locally available, around \$100, eligible for the rebate, and easy to use!

NEW UTAH E-BIKE LAW

As summer approaches, more children and teens will be riding e-bikes around neighborhoods, parks, and trails throughout Utah. Recently, Utah updated its e-bike safety laws through HB 381. These updates include several important changes aimed at reducing serious injuries and helping families ride more safely. By following a few simple precautions, everyone can enjoy summer rides that are fun, safe, and injury-free.

NEW UTAH E-BIKE LAW

TAKES EFFECT MAY 6, 2026

- ALL E-BIKE AND E-SCOOTER RIDERS UNDER 21 MUST WEAR CPSC HELMETS ON ROADS
- ALL E-MOTORCYCLE RIDERS UNDER 21 MUST WEAR DOT-APPROVED HELMETS
- ALL DEVICES THAT TRAVEL OVER 20 MPH WITHOUT PEDALING ARE CONSIDERED E-MOTORCYCLES AND MAY REQUIRE
 - DRIVER'S LICENSE
 - MOTORCYCLE ENDORSEMENT
 - INSURANCE
- THOSE UNDER 16 MAY NOT OPERATE E-MOTORCYCLES OR HIGH-POWERED E-DEVICES ON ANY PUBLIC ROAD.

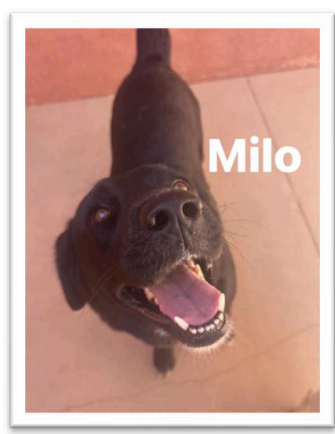
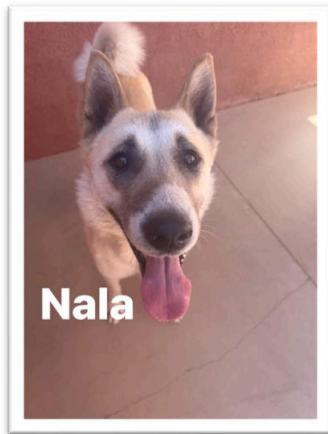

Community, Creativity, and Safer Streets: The Story Behind Safety in Art

The “Safety in Art” project grew out of conversations that began after a teen scooter rider was hit by a car while crossing near Vista School last year. Residents, city leaders, and community partners started asking an important question: how can we slow traffic and make our streets safer in a way that also reflects the character and creativity of Ivins?



Led by Ivins Inspired in partnership with the Ivins City Arts Commission, the pilot project uses artistic traffic-calming treatments near Rocky Vista University and the Southern Utah Veterans Home to help increase driver awareness and create safer crossings for pedestrians. The corridor is also used by some Vista School students and families.

The Center Street corridor was selected after a community walk audit, facilitated by the Strong Towns WashCo team, that brought together city leaders, residents, Santa Clara-Ivins Public Safety, Vista School representatives, the Southern Utah Veterans Home, and other community partners to identify areas where pedestrian safety improvements were most needed.

The project uses colorful art designed to visually narrow lanes and encourage slower driving speeds while also adding beauty and identity to these important community spaces.

The idea was inspired in part by research from the Bloomberg Philanthropies Asphalt Art Initiative, which has shown that asphalt art can improve street safety, slow traffic, while also strengthening community connection. Along the way, Ivins Inspired researched projects from around the country and connected directly with cities that had already implemented similar installations to learn what worked, what didn't, and what they learned through the process. We also gathered input from Washington County transportation officials to help make sure the project aligned with local traffic safety standards and roadway requirements.

One of the most meaningful parts of this project has been the collaboration behind it. What started as a community conversation grew into more than 15 months of walk audits, design revisions, traffic safety discussions, grant writing, coordination meetings, creative problem solving, and yes, probably far more conversations about asphalt patterns and striping than any of us ever expected to have. Like many community projects, there were unexpected obstacles and shifting timelines along the way, but the process also showed what is possible when residents, local organizations, artists, public safety, educators, and city leadership work together toward a shared goal.

This project truly came together because of a community effort, and we are incredibly grateful to the many city leaders, employees, residents, volunteers, artists, and partner organizations who contributed their time, ideas, expertise, and support to help bring it to life.

The effort brought together Ivins City leadership, the Ivins City Arts Commission, Santa Clara-Ivins Public Safety, Vista School, Rocky Vista University, the Southern Utah Veterans Home, Strong Towns WashCo, the Southern Utah Bicycle Alliance (SUBA), volunteers, and residents from across the community. From residents who participated in the original walk audit to the Ivins City Public Works team working through implementation logistics, this project reflects the engaged and caring spirit that makes Ivins special.

The Utah Tech University Art Department also played a major role in the design process under the guidance of Brian Astle, Assistant Professor of Art at Utah Tech University, with students submitting concepts for the project. Student artist Nicki Douberley's design was selected for the Center Street roundabout installation. Throughout the process, the team learned a lot about balancing creativity with traffic safety standards, including how limited color palettes and repeating patterns function most effectively as traffic-calming elements.

The project also included a two-week traffic study conducted by Santa Clara-Ivins Public Safety to document vehicle speeds and driver behavior before installation. That data will help us to evaluate the project after the art is installed and determine whether the treatments successfully improve safety outcomes.

Special thanks also go to Jake Adams and Russell Mangum, with Straight Stripe Painting, Inc., the company installing the artwork. Russell and Jake have been the amazing contacts at Straight Stripe who worked with us patiently every step of the way to help ensure this project happened. Over more than a year of planning, adjustments, technical challenges, and shifting timelines, they consistently brought expertise, flexibility, and a collaborative attitude to the table. Their willingness to problem-solve with us, answer endless questions, and help navigate the many details involved made a huge difference in bringing this project to life. Thank you, Jake and Russell!

As local Ivins residents, the owners of Straight Stripe are proud to support the community through projects like this roundabout safety improvement effort. Since 2004, Straight Stripe has worked with local municipalities on projects focused on improving safety for the traveling public while providing high-quality products and services. Their experience, professionalism, and commitment to community safety have been invaluable throughout this project.

“Safety in Art” was fully funded through grants and is an example of how communities can combine art, research, partnerships, and resident involvement to create safer and more connected public spaces. More importantly, it’s just the beginning. As Ivins continues to grow, projects like this show how thoughtful collaboration and community engagement can help preserve the safety, character, and sense of connection that residents value so deeply.

We hope more residents will continue joining the conversation and helping shape what comes next for our community. This project is just the start of a larger community conversation — and action — around how we continue making Ivins safer for residents of all ages and abilities.

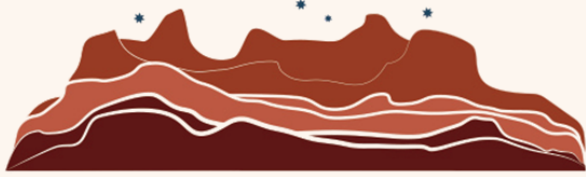
